Welcome/Call to Order: (Pam): Thank you all for coming! Mr. Lubisco will be here later on. We are going to get started. We have a guest tonight, Jonathan from Ms. Chocolate Fundraising.
(Jonathon): My name is Jonathon Schneider from Ms. Chocolate Educational Products Fundraising. The Spring Brochure is chocolate, kitchen items, along with a mixture of spring products. Out of all the catalogs, the biggest is the Fall Catalog with wrapping paper, chocolate, and gifts. We have a Christmas brochure as well as smaller ones such as cookie dough and popcorn.
$\sim$ How do the brochure sales work?
(Jonathon): I make it as simple as possible. You tell me how many kids are in the school, and I give you brochures in a kit with the order form and prize brochure included. What is nice about the prize brochure is that all the prize levels are cumulative. I also create the letter for you. People also have an option to purchase online. No matter what catalogs you pick, you can still purchase from any other one online to credit the school. We make all the kits for you. I pick up all the order forms to get them processed. Once it's shipped to the school, it is all packaged by student. The only thing we offer not packaged by student, is the pies.

We offer a $\$ 200$ shopping spree when you sign up for our Fall or Spring brochures as a way of saying thank you. We also offer a Holiday Shop. If you choose to participate by using the Main Brochure and the Holiday Shop, we'll give you a $\$ 500$ shopping spree out of the brochure.
~Is there any incentive with the Holiday Shop if you generate a certain amount of money? (Jonathon): If you choose the Holiday Shop and the catalog, I can give you the $\$ 500$ shopping spree.
$\sim$ What is the price ranges of these items?
(Jonathon): It ranges from a few cents up to $\$ 10-\$ 15$, but most items are under $\$ 5$ knowing who the audience is. I can get you in to the website so you can see the prices of items. If there was any special incentive that you get from your current Holiday Shop, we could possibly match it. Tell me what you think is reasonable, and I would be more than happy to see about matching it.

Cash and carry sales are great for smaller groups to fundraise. We have Hershey products, chocolate covered pretzels, and our own private label. World's finest chocolate bars make the best profit from sales. There is no money up front. You have a full month to sell the product. If no box is opened, I will take it back at the end of the month. If a box is opened, it's not returnable.

We also sell custom T-shirts. Ms. Chocolate has partnered with Educational Products who has in-house artists to create the shirts. There's no charge for the artwork.

The last thing we do is a school supply program. We stock over 6,000 items where it's set up so parents can purchase what is on their teacher's school supply list. We make custom kits for each grade level. The cost for each kit depends on what is on the teacher's list, but you do see an average of $30 \%$ cost savings than you going to every store to purchase each item yourself. We have a school year product guarantee. If any product fails during the school year, we will replace it for free.
$\sim$ What does the school get back for the school supply sale?
(Jonathon): The school supply sale is dependent upon your mark-up. You decide how much to mark up just like the holiday shop.

Treasurer: (Monique): Our bank account currently has $\$ 43,846.19$, with extra in the account due to the gift card raffle fundraiser. Please take a look at the December/January report and let me know if you have any questions. We have received a few new memberships. We always have $t$-shirts and sweatshirt orders every month. We started a few purchases for tricky tray items, such as envelopes, stamps and yearbooks. Reflections Studio gave us a profit of $\$ 2,289.48$ just for using them for school pictures.

President: (Pam):
Reflections Studio sent a thank you card. Also, the P.B.A sent one for another \$1,000 check we received from the clothing bin out front. Whatever gets donated into the bin gives us a percentage back. This was the second $\$ 1,000$ check from P.B.A.

Tricky Tray - The first meeting is this Wednesday, February $13^{\text {th }}$ here in the library for those who signed up for the committee. If you can't make it, so I'll send out a follow up email. A letter went home for donation lists to all the classes.

Remind Me App - Verizon will not be charging for it, so we can keep on using it.

Candy-grams - These were due last Friday. We are just under 500 candy-grams.
Box Tops - There was a check for $\$ 267+/$ - that came in from the most recent collection.
Jeans Days for Tricky Tray - This is going on throughout the district for teachers, where they pay to have dress down. All of the money goes towards Tricky Tray prizes.

Bake Sale - March $27^{\text {th }}$, with a rain date of the $28^{\text {th }}$. This will also go towards Tricky Tray.
Drama Club - We will purchase an Ad in their playbill of Little Shop of Horrors.
Vice President - Committee Chair: (Silke):
Book Fair - Will take place sometime either before or after Spring Break. We don't have a final date yet.

Scholarships - The applications will go out to all graduating high school students before Spring Break, and they will be collected after. Usually $15-25$ students apply, 10 will be interviewed, and 6 will receive $\$ 1,000$ scholarships.

Vice President - Grade Level Oversight: (Nicole):
Talent Show - February $1^{\text {st }}$ was the date of the show. We collected a lot of donated food that will be delivered to FISH. Our total made after expenses are taken out is $\$ 467.00$. The fundraiser for the Leyden Family was $\$ 131$, and we discussed having another bake sale to go towards the Leyden Family. The PTO may help round-up the total. They have an education fund set up for the kids.

Upcoming Parties - Spring party for most grades. Team Leaders please check you're your teacher. Some are having it the first day of Spring March 20th, and some are having them the day before Spring Break. Kindergarten has their 100th Day Party and Valentine's Day Party back to back February $13^{\text {th }}$ and 14 this week. Not all the grades are collecting items for Valentine's Day. Make sure you reach out to you teachers for all events coming up for your grade level.

Yearbooks - To receive the discount for you Faber yearbook, your order must be placed by Friday, February $15^{\text {th }}$. After that is goes up to $\$ 20$. LMS yearbook is $\$ 20$ until March $1^{\text {st }}$ which goes up to $\$ 25$ after that.
